» San Diego is highly walkable! Steps away from the Convention Center is the Gaslamp Quarter, an urban playground offering dining, shopping, and entertainment.

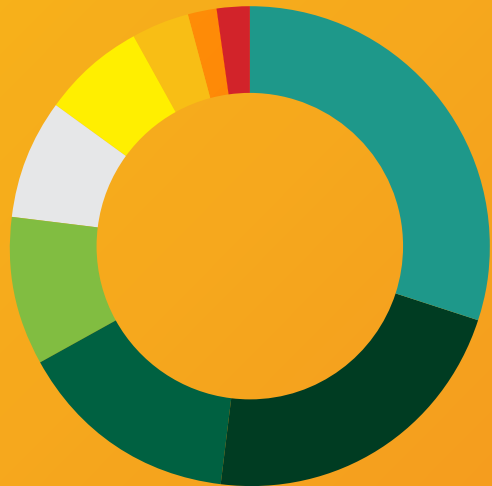
